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This exquisite fingertip towel can be a gift for you or a loved one.

Sewing Supplies:

White 3300 Embroidery Machine

White Sewing Machine with Straight and Zig Zag stitch

White Embroidery Designs “Christmas” Part # 146 000107

¼ yard of Linen or linen-like fabric

3/8 yard of 60” green and white plaid (100% cotton found in home decorating section of your fabric store), yardage is for two towels.

Sulky or Robison Anton Embroidery threads

Schmetz Embroidery needle 80/12

Schmetz Universal needle 75/11

Schmetz Wing needle 100/16

Regular sewing thread

America Sews Tear-A-Way Stabilizer

Ominigrad Ruler

Water soluble pen

Olfar Rotary Cutter

Rajah Pressing Cloth



Cut:

From Plaid fabric:

Fold piece in half and cut on the fold to make two towels (the selvage will be used at the bottom of the towel)

From Linen:

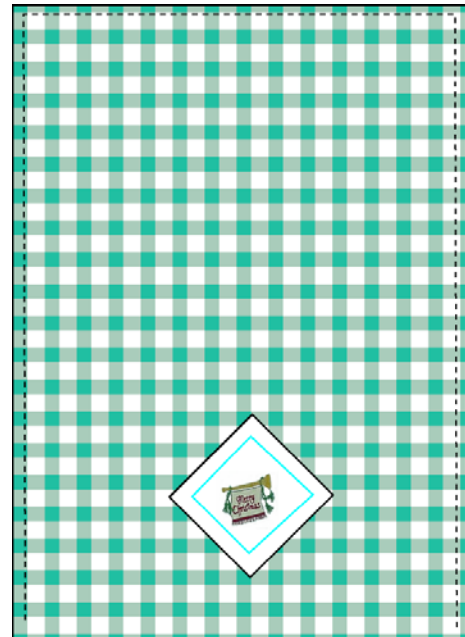
Cut one strip 4" wide by the width of the fabric – then cut strip in 4" squares.

Embroider:

Hoop linen or linen-like fabric at a 45-degree angle as shown. Select design and embroider on the White 3300 Embroidery Machine. When done clip all jump stitches and press design from wrong side first and press right side using a pressing cloth. Repeat for other towel.

Sew:

1. Insert an 80/12 needle and thread your White sewing machine with regular sewing thread. Select straight stitch. Turn all three raw edges of plaid towels under a 1/4" and 1/4" again. Sew hems (Remember selvage will be used for bottom of towel). Press.
2. From a piece of paper, cut a 3 1/2" square.
3. Center the 3 1/2" square over design, on point. On point means that it is at a 45 degree angle. Cut.
4. Find center of towel. Center embroidered square as shown.
5. Measure from edge of square one inch in and trace with your water soluble pen.
6. Insert the wing needle in your sewing machine and thread with red rayon embroidered thread. Select a narrow zig zag stitch and adjust the stitch length to 2.0. Sew on the traced line around the design.
7. When done, pull threads around edges up to the zigzag stitch to create the fringes.
